Local Pilot Club Will Hear Convention Report Tonight

Mrs. J. A. DeJaifre, president of the Pilot Club of Torrance, has just returned from the 35th annual convention of Pilot International held at the Hotel Fontainebleau in Miami Beach, Fla., July 18 through 21. She will give her report of the convention to the club tonight at its regular July business meeting.

In addition to the business sessions at the convention, Mrs. DeJaifre attended panel discussions with community service which were attended by top ranking officials of such organizations as the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, Girl Scouts of the U.S.A., and the National Safety Council.

One of the highlights of the convention was the acceptance by a representative from the French government of three certificates representing donations from more than 400 Pilot Clubs throughout the United States, Canada, France, Bermuda, England, Hawaii, and Japan, to purchase trees to be planted at Wimortiers, Orne, France, toward the replacement of those destroyed by bombing by the U.S. Air Force during the Normandy invasion.

The featured speaker of the convention was Mrs. Vera M. Dean, author of "The U.S. and Russia" and "Foreign Policy Without Fear."

The climax of the convention was the installation of Mrs. Jean Conacher, an educator of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, as international president.

Among the other delegates attending the convention from California were Mrs. Ruth Cunningham, the governor of District 16 (California) and a member of the Pilot Club of San Gabriel Valley, and Mrs. Henrietta B. Cauhape, the district lieutenant governor and a member of the Pilot Club of San Jose.

Local Piano Pupils Score High Grades

Gertrude Lumsden, Torrance piano and voice teacher, entered nine of her pupils in the recent auditions held by the National Guild of Piano Teachers, Redondo section, and all nine scored grades in the superior and excellent classification while playing memorized programs before Guild Adjudicator Dr. Elliott Griffin, internationally known composer and pianist.

Eight-year-old Barbara Steinwachs received her local pin and certificate for her first audition. Receiving district pins and certificates were Philip Carney and Bruce Shuckney.

The audition, an annual event, is sponsored by the National Guild of Piano Teachers. Students of guild teachers are heard by a music critic or adjudicator from the American College of Music, allowances being made for age and length of study of each student. They are judged on about 35 points of musicianship, including tone quality, rhythm, accuracy, technique, phrasing, balance, dynamics and interpretation.

Besides her guild activities, Mrs. Lumsden is president of South Bay Branch of the Music Teachers' Association of California and an active member of South Bay Music-Arts Association.
