Citizens Better Road Committee Urging \$150 Million Bond Issue

A resolution calling for placing a \$150,000,000 bond issue for critically needed improvements of secondary highways throughout Los Angeles County on the November ballot has been adopted by the finance subcommittee of the Citizens Committee for Better Roads, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported yesterday.

The resolution will be presented to the general membership of the Better Roads Committee, Leon J. Garrig, chairman, on Aug. 3. Adopted on motion of Attorney Benjamin A. Chipkin, seconded by Douglas H. Freeman, the resolution requests the engineering subcommittee to formulate a county-wide secondary road deficiency construction program not to exceed \$150,000,000.

This program would call for the expenditure of the bond issue money on roads now in emergency need of improvement. The decision as to what roads would be included would be made by the engineering subcommittee, headed by E. E. East, chief engineer of the Automobile Club of Southern California.

15,000 Miles in County East pointed out that there are 46 incorporated cities in the County, excluding Avalon, and that there are approximately 10,000 miles of city streets, plus 5000 miles of highways in county unincorporated areas, including state highways.

"The highway user does not know, nor does he care, what political jurisdiction has control of the highways he travels. He is only interested in getting from where he is to where he wants to go."

"The highway transportation problem of the County can not be correctly appraised by political jurisdiction. It must be viewed from the standpoint of the user of the highway," East declared recently.

A Good Beginning S. Charles Lee is chairman of the finance subcommittee, and Wesley G. Simmons is vice-chairman.

"This recommendation for a \$150,000,000 road improvement bond issue is a great step forward," Supervisor Hahn said. "While the total road deficiency in Los Angeles County is \$402,000,000, the proposed bond issue of \$150,000,000 is certainly a good beginning at solving the whole problem."

With additional money from the state and federal government as a result of the \$35,000,000,000 road bill recently signed into law, the whole problem can be solved in a few years," Hahn declared.

He pointed out that the program would include major roads and secondary highways in cities as well as unincorporated areas in Los Angeles County.

Many Local Streets He listed the following roads as typical of those to be included in the program: Imperial Hwy., El Segundo Blvd., Rosecrans Ave., Normandie Ave., Ave. Aviation Blvd., Anza Ave., Inglewood Ave., Prairie Ave., 190th St., Avalon Blvd., Redondo Beach Blvd., Compton Blvd. and Vermont Ave.

"I certainly congratulate and commend the members of the finance subcommittee for their hard work, careful thought and deep concern over the road problems in working out this excellent recommendation," Supervisor Hahn declared.

Other members of the finance subcommittee are: Harrison Baker, former State Highway Commissioner, Pasadena; Harold J. Brandenburg, Firestone Tire and Rubber Co.; E. E. East, Automobile Club of Southern California; William A. J. Emmens, Whittier; Hayden F. Jones, president, Property Owners Assn.; Mark A. Thoreson, Van Nuys; Earl M. Watson, Sepulveda; and Clarence A. Winder, Pasadena, representing the League of California Cities.

The Committee for Better Roads was established by the board of supervisors on motion of Supervisor Hahn to study the road and traffic problem in Los Angeles County and to recommend methods of improving major roads and highways.
