Car Demolished By Huge Tanker

A huge General Petroleum truck tanker, a passenger car and a third vehicle smashed together at the 190th St. truck entrance to GP's refinery here at about 1:20 p.m., Tuesday, snuffing out the life of the car's driver, Lief Allen Rosenberg, 23, of 20431 New Hampshire Ave.

The victim was pronounced dead on arrival at Harbor General Hospital following the crash. Witnesses said his car was completely demolished as the tanker and car met virtually head-on. The third vehicle, a General Petroleum pick-up truck, also was involved in the crash.

Raymond M. Meyers, 52, of 2010 paisy Ave, Long Beach, driver of the tanker, was uninjured Carl W. Schilling, 42, of 6502 Gundry, Long Beach, was driver of the pick-up. Neither was cited.

Schilling was injured slightly, according to police reports of the accident.

The tanker was going east on 190th, the car west on the same street at the time of the wreck, while the pick-up reportedly was attempting to turn onto 190th from the refinery, authorities said. The truck apparently was attempting in a left turn.
