Empty Saddle Club ring will resound with shouts of applause as the prancing hoofs of fine horses go through their paces at the third annual Rolling Hills Junior Horse Show scheduled for Sept. 2 and 3.

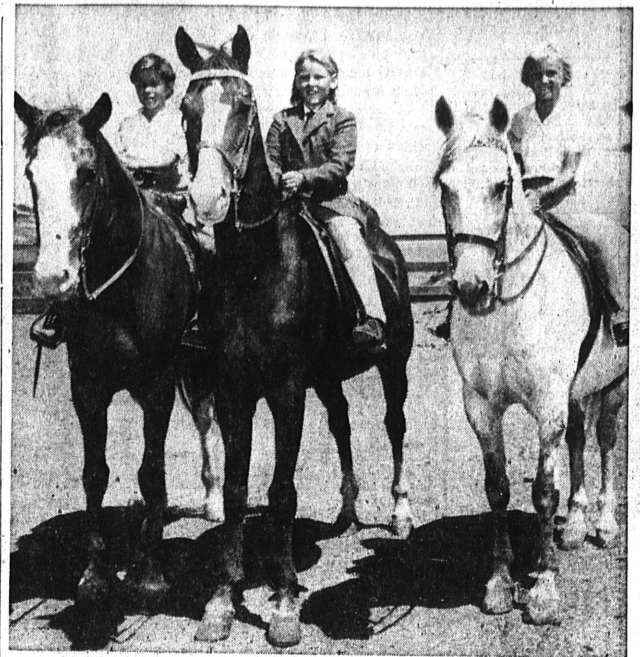
Program for the Sunday event which will begin at 9 a.m., includes local western pleasure horse, A. H. S. A medal class—hunt seat, keyhole race, AHSA medal class—stock seat, English horsemanship for 13 years and under and handy hunters.

The afternoon event on the same day will include knock down and out jumpers, pole bending, local trail horse, boot race, hunter hacks, western horsemanship—13 years and under, novice English horsemanship and stock horse.

Program for the Monday show which begins at 9 a.m., will include rescue race, working hunters, AHSA medal class—saddle horse seat, trail horse, touch and out jumpers and western pleasure horses.

Monday afternoon show beginning at 1:30 p.m., will have as its program Maclay trophy class, English pleasure horse, So. California stock seat championship, novice hunters, three gaited saddle horses, quadrangle race, novice Western horsemanship and jumpers.

At the conclusion will be the presentation of high point rider awards by judge Eldon Fairbanks of Pasadena. Gymkhana division will be judged by Joe Rau of Torrance. Included in this division will be keyhole race, pole bending, boot race, rescue race and quadrangle race.
