On Sept. 17, the Gardena Cooperative Nursery School will begin its fall semester for pre-school age children. The school is under the direction of Mrs. Rosalie Greene, who has had seven years experience with cooperative nursery schools in this area. There are periods of free play and directed play. Printing, wood work, clay modeling and other means of self expression are emphasized to develop manual skills.

Surface rooted Rhododendrons, Azaleas and Camellias like mulch of oak leaf mold to protect them during hot summer days. The California Association of Nurserymen recommends the mulch be spread over the rooting area and kept moist.
