As these five generations gathered many mental pictures of Torrance in the early days were recalled and amazement at the growth expressed. Mrs. Hartman is the widow of Albert Hartman who passed away in 1933. He brought the first red car to Torrance and his children and Mrs. Hartman were frequent passengers. Torrance was "a wide place in the road" and the children had such fun visiting the old glass factory here, said Mrs. Hartman. The children to this day have small glasses and vases made in that old factory and given to them by the workers. The country around Torrance, Strawberry Park, now Gardena, Lomita and down to Portuguese Bend was at that time in beautiful Jap gardens. The Hartmans came to Los Angeles in 1904. All of their children were born there and attended LA schools but they were such frequent visitors to Torrance that they knew many of the first settlers here.

The six Hartman children here last Sunday for the reunion were Mrs. Amy Cole, with whom Mrs. Hartman lives on Anza; Mrs. Alberta Angeloty, of Venice; Harry, Jack and Albert, Hartman all of Los Angeles, and Mrs. Tence Nelson, of Roseville.
