Music Team Returns From Red China to Join Crusade

To join the Torrance Prophectic Bible lecture series will be the talented man and wife music team Henry and Orpha Meissner — Mrs. Meissner at the organ, piano and marimba — Meissner, bass-baritone, will lead the community song service preceding each lecture and play on his precious Stradivari violin used when on a similar mission in the large cities of Red China.

Mrs. Meissner is a graduate of Colorado "U". Meissner spent 11 years of his music life and study in Saxony, Germany. They met in the ministry of music at home and in mission lands. They were forced to leave Red China where they served a mission term until the so-called Communist "Liberation Days."

Meissner stated that for 16 years they have been serving in an uninterrupted group of "Prophectic Bible Lecture Series" directing the music — male choruses, choirs, and other voice and string instrumental groups. He has appeared on NBC, New York City, radio programs and many other stations across the nation and the Orient.

He said, he even sang and played his great Paolo Maggini violin in the Catholic chapel on top of the Mount of Olives near Jerusalem to cheer some of their Arab-Christian friends there, who wept because they had not heard a song or good music for three years.

He has had to play the violin at certain border line inspections to prove that this "thing in this beautiful case" was not a machine gun. At the Torrance Civic Auditorium, he will lead a rousing Community Sing each night, leading the "hymns and songs of all churches."

"It is very timely in our Torrance community that both young and old shall get together more and more for such inspirations as will be held starting Sunday, Sept. 30. A Junior Choir for children will also be organized and your child may come to join," sponsors say.
