Aircraft Firm Gets Contract For Titanium

An Air Force contract for \$2,220,070 has been awarded North American Aviation, Inc. by the Air Materiel Command for research to determine the adaptability of new titanium alloys for supersonic aircraft and missiles.

This is the first separate titanium research contract ever awarded the company, which has previously done such research as part of its regular airplane production contracts. The work will be done in the firm's Los Angeles plant.

Three-Year Contract
The contract will run for three years, according to L. P. Spalding, laboratory director, and will involve the testing and evaluation of new titanium alloys, now in pilot production, that with heat treatment can reach a tensile strength of 170-180,000 pounds per square inch. This represents an increase of 40 to 50 per cent in strength over titanium alloys now in use and is especially important in the construction of today's high-speed jet aircraft and long-range missiles.

Company researchers hope to form these new alloys in a soft condition, when they will be as easy to work as present low-strength alloys, and then heat-treat them to get high-strength properties. The same thing has been done in steel and aluminum for many years.

Titanium Studied
The researchers will evaluate limited amounts of three or four new titanium alloys for physical properties, heat treatment, forming characteristics, etc. From these alloys, one will be selected and obtained in large quantities for a complete study of its use for typical aircraft parts.

This will involve new tooling developments and manufacturing techniques. Finally, selected parts and typical structural components will be subjected to static tests at various temperatures as final proof of the suitability of the new alloy.

Tomorrow is the last day to get your ASB card. If you haven't purchased yours yet be sure to get it by then.

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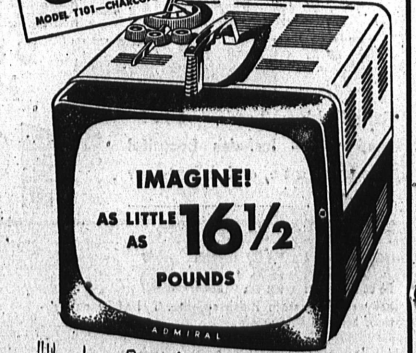
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
