## Nine Youths Nabbed In Narcotics Raid

In a surprise raid Friday night, Sheriff's deputies picked up \$4000 in dope and nine men and youths described as members of a ring supplying teen-age dope users in this area. Led by Sgt. Jay Stroh, of the Sheriff's narcotics detail, deputies swept down on the nine suspects in two separate raids, one at a bowling center just outside of Torrance and in an alley in the 1200 block on Madrid Ave.

Stroh said the raid netted more than 7000 barbiturate pills, and a half-pound of marijuana, valued at about \$4000. The raid climaxed five weeks of investigation by members of the narcotics detail and the Torrance police.

The new office will be opened for business at 8 a.m., Monday, Dec. 3, according to Paul Thorgrinson, district supervisor for the DMV.

Stores in the downtown Torrance business district will be open each evening until 9 p.m. beginning Dec. 7, it was announced yesterday by Charles Gots, president of the Retail Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce.

Gots said the increased schedule will be followed to offer better service to the many persons in this area who are unable to shop in daylight hours.

### Census Final—82,241

The city of Torrance gained exactly 60,000 persons between the regular federal census of 1950 and the special census of 1956, final tabulations of the Oct. 10 count here showed this week.

Official confirmation of the 1955 special census was received Friday by City Manager George Stevens and showed that the 1956 census was 82,241—exactly 60,000 more than the 22,241 official tally here in 1950.
