

PV PLAYERS TO GIVE 'GOODBYE, MY FANCY'

"Goodbye, My Fancy," a comedy which had a successful run on Broadway in 1948, will be presented by the Palos Verdes Players in a three-night run starting next Thursday, Nov. 29.

The performance will be presented on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, Nov. 29-Dec. 1, in Dapplegray Auditorium, Palos Verdes Dr. N., near Rolling Hills Rd., Palos Verdes. On opening night all students, including night school will be admitted for half price with proper identification.

It is the story of a congresswoman, Agatha Reed, who returns to her alma mater for an honorary degree. The college president and the Life magazine photographer both rekindle old flames while Miss Reed's indiscreet undergraduate days unfold. All the action takes place in a girls' dormitory.

Secretary Plays

Mrs. Lisbeth Ludwig, dramatic and speech instructor at Narbonne high school, plays the part of the officious alumnae secretary, Miss Shackelford, who continually gets underfoot. Mrs. Ludwig has had a full background in the theatre. She has been associated with the Beverly Hills Playhouse, Sherman Oaks Playhouse, Glendale Center Theatre and the Rancho Community Theatre. Her roles have been varied.

Before coming to Narbonne she taught dramatics at Colton High and San Bernardino Junior High. Before that she attended UCLA and UC at Berkeley.

Set Designer

Mrs. Irene Kinsey, Lomita, is the set designer. She has been active with the Players for three years and is presently color coordinator and wallpaper consultant at John's Paint and Window Shades in Torrance. She has contributed her artistic talents in the publicity, set design, or costume fields in most of the plays since she joined the Players.

She cast, directed and played in a formal concert reading of "John Brown's Body" for the Palos Verdes chapter of the UN. Her most recent contribution was the statue of the founder of Hamlin used in the children's play, "The Pied Piper of Hamelin," in September. When she is not

working or taking care of her three children she paints oil portraits and interior murals.

Newcomer Parks

Miss Durfee Parkins, 1955 graduate of the University of California at Berkeley, is cast as Jo Wintner, physical ed representative in Agatha Reed's welcoming committee. She has just moved to Southern California where she lives with her sister, Irene Kinsey, after spending the last five years in the San Francisco Bay area.

Other roles in the comedy include a college president, five college girls, professors, a secretary, president of the board of trustees, and other stereotypes associated with college life.

Mrs. Margaret Middleton, Manhattan Beach, plays the lead. She has just returned from Saudi Arabia where she was active there in the Abbaquai Players for two and a half years. A commercial fashion artist and model, she has taught modeling in Hollywood and belongs to a number of sketch groups where she has exhibited her work in several shows.

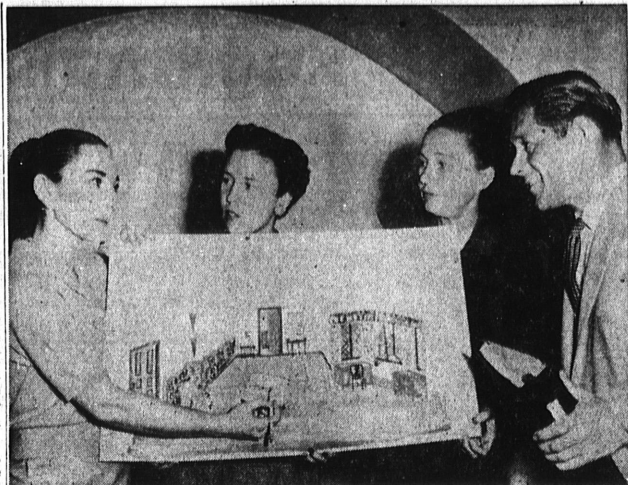
Legion Asks Members to Back Chest

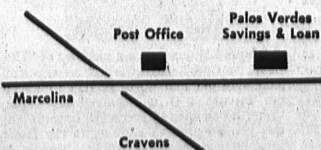
