EC Warwhoop Takes Seventh Consecutive All-American

All-American honors were conferred upon the El Camino College Warwhoop for the seventh consecutive semester according to an announcement made this week by the Associated Collegiate Press, donor of the award for college parks controlled.

In garnering the coveted award, the Warwhoop tabulated a total score of 1715 points; 115 more than the number required for the top honor rating of the evaluating organization whose headquarters are located on the campus of the University of Minnesota.

Eight JC's Win The Warwhoop was one of eight junior college newspapers of its class to receive the All-American award in judging which included college papers from all areas of the nation, nearly 500 in all.
