"Good employers have learned long ago," said Mrs. Evans, "that it doesn't pay to size a man up or down by a physical disability. They keep in mind the fact that most disabled veterans have had intensive training under government supervision—training that not only concels out their handicaps but emphasizes their abilities over their disabilities."

She cited these facts, as shown by statistics:
Disabled veterans are good workers, good producers on the job, and safe workers besides. They have better safety records than the able-bodied. They also tend to be more stable and reliable day in and day out. They appreciate their jobs.
