

Watch These Turn Signals When Driving


Make sure the turn signals on your car are off when you are not going to turn, warns the California Highway Patrol.

"Approved turn signals may be used to indicate you are about to make a left or right turn in traffic," declared Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell. "Use them properly, but make sure they are turned off after the turn is made.

Recently a quite serious accident occurred when a driver failed to make a turn at an intersection after displaying an lighted turn signal for some distance prior to entering the intersection," Caldwell stated. "An oncoming driver, also with turn signal lift, figuring the other car was going to turn, made a left turn in front of the oncoming car."

ACTION As a juror you are a judge of the evidence presented at a trial. In order to reach a proper verdict, you have to decide what to believe and what not to believe. One person can't believe two diametrically opposed statements.

metrically opposed statements.

But alas, there is no fool-proof way to sift out the true from the false. Lacking a surefire truth detector, our jury system is the best method yet found.

So the jurors must consider the factors affecting the witnesses' creditability so far as the evidence discloses them—age, education, work, or looks and conduct on the witness stand: relationships between the witness and the parties; stakes in the trial's outcome; bias, if it appears; the strength of the witness' memory; the chances they have had to see, hear, and know what they have testified to; their candor; the reasonableness of their testimony.

Witnesses often differ in details due to their different opportunities or powers to observe, or their memory of what they saw, heard, or did. In view of these differences try to reconcile gaps when you reasonably can.


Consider why a witness may make untrue statements: Is it because of confusion, nervousness, mistakes, poor, me m or y, thoughtlessness, lack of intelligence, or evil intent?

The law assumes that the common sense and experience of 12 men will be more reliable than that of only one, in finding the truth among the statements offered by witnesses in a trial. The conclusions of the 12 jurymen will be safer and wiser because of the broad background of education, age, profession, and experience brought to bear on disputed matters.
