
## **Board Orders Final Design By Architect**

Preliminary plans and speci-fications for the new Torrance Courthouse to be built adja-cent to the police station on the city's civic center, have been approved by the board of supervisors on the recom-mendation of Supervisor Bur-ton W, Chace. At the same time, the board ordered Architect Kenneth Wing to proceed with final plans for the structure. Cost of the new facility has been estimated at \$274,027. The plans aproved this week call for a one-story building with space for all offices per-tinent to the operation of a court.

with space for all offices par-tinent to the operation of a court. Architect Kenneth S. Wing presented the plans for the building showing 10,112 square feet in the one-story brick structure. Included will be a court room, jury room, and offices for the judge marshall and deputies, district attorney. sheriff, and other auxiliary personnel. It also will include detention rooms for prisoners. A third judge added to the staff of the South Bay Munici-pal Court will be located in the new building, climaxing a long fight by local residents to get the court located here. The new building is expect-ed to be completed some time next year. In addition to the building, the site will contain 56,000 square feet of parking area, Chace said.
