

Garden Chatter By LORING BIGELOW

It is rather surprising how amount of insecticide as well nany people own spray type as the water that you place in-the water pressure on their It is rather surprising how many people own spray type applicators which work from the water pressure on their garden hose, and it is even more surprising the large num-ber of gardeners that do not know how to use them prop-erly. Throùgh improper use the results are far from satis-factory, and it is very easy to blame the spray attachment, the insecticide or fungicide contained therein, or the deal-er from which it was pur-chased. More often than not, however, the blame rests up-on the operator. The first thing that should

to the jar. The most common fault is to look at the jar itself and see that it is only a pint or quart and to then cut the man-ufacturers recommendations. This should not be done, for the regulting mixture will ba extremely weak. Always remember to look upon the vessel below the gun nozzle as a container the size that it represents. Think of the container as being a 1½ gal. bottle, a 3 gal. bottle, or a 20 galion and to add the ma-terial accordingly. Mever try to retain any ma-terial left over until the next spray time, and be sure to al-ways clean the gun thoroughly with clear water. Do not have the faucet turned on full un-less your water pressure is very, very low.

These figures that are upon the container represent the total number of gallons of properly mixed poison which will be applied when the jar is holding the proper mixture and then emptied through water pressure.

Any insecticide or fungicide that you use gives the gallon equivalent to use in mixing. Should the instructions on the bottle of insecticide state to use at the ratio of one tea-spoonful per gallon and your hose type sprayer is of the 1% gal. capacity type, you would place 1½ teaspoonfuls of the material into the spray jar and fill the jar with water before attaching it to your hose. Should your gun be of gal. capacity, you would use 3 gals. of the solution and then fill with water before attach-ling to the hose. If you should desire to mix only half the amount of spray material that is possible with the type gun that you own, this can be done by using a corresp. Allongty less
