



New Red Cross Class Stresses Civil Defense

The importance of equipping oneself with the proper know-how as the only sure means of coping with the effects of a grave disaster-emergency is being stressed here today by Red Cross officials.

To obtain this know-how, the Red Cross has urged homemakers to enroll in a special "Care of the Sick and Injured" course, which will begin Tuesday, 7 p.m. at the Lomita School, 2211 W. 247th St.

Civil Defense Stressed

Mrs. Fred E. Johnston, chairman of nursing services, pointed out that the new course—a revised version of the home nursing course—includes specific Civil Defense training to meet the requirements requested by the Federal Civil Defense Administration.

The class will not only instruct individuals on how to care for their own family members, but will enable them to assist the professional medical staff in the event of a major disaster.

Two-Hour Classes

Classes will be held every Tuesday and Thursday, 7 to 9 p.m., for three weeks, and registration should be made with the Torrance Red Cross Headquarters or the San Pedro Headquarters.

"Because the knowledge of what to do, and how to do it, could literally spell the difference between life a nd death, we are annealing to all

ference between life and death, we are appealing to all household heads to enroll in this course," stressed Mrs. Johnston.

Those completing the course will be issued Red Cross certificates, qualifying them to serve with Civil Defense as mursing assistants in event of a national emergency.
