Lutheran School to Open in September

Registration for the First Lutheran Church's new Christian elementary school will begin next week, according to Pastor Paul Wenske.

The school will open in the fall for kindergartners and first and second graders. Registration dates will be from June 18 to 21 and June 25 to 28 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and from June 19 to 16 from 7:30 to 9 p.m.

Present plans call for addition of one grade to the school each year. All public school courses will be taught with a religious course emphasizing spiritual values. Teachers will meet the regular state qualifications.

The new school building will have a playground and the other modern educational equipment. It is the first Protestant Christian school in the area.

A school board, headed by Pete Durst, foreman of Field Shop Service, National Supply, will guide the affairs of the school. Members of the congregation are on the board.

Top Basketball Player Slated To Speak

Joe Grabill, who for two years has played with the "Venture for Victory" basketball team, will be guest speaker at the confirmation ceremony this Sunday at the 11 a.m. service in the Lomita Missionary Church, 2043 Lomita Blvd.

The team is composed of outstanding basketball players from a number of colleges and universities throughout the United States. Under the leadership of Coach Don Odle of Taylor University in Indiana, they have had a unique ministry in various countries of the world including countries of the Orient and South America.

In the five years since its beginning, his teams, playing the best teams of the countries where they have toured, have accumulated 304 wins against four losses.
