## Nuclear reactors designed and built by Atomics International are putting the peaceful atom to work around the world

Right here in the San Fernando Valley-at Canoga Park and in the nearby Santa Susana Mountains-Atomics International has created one of the world's most famous centers in the development of nuclear reactors for the new Atomic Age. Among the different reactor projects pio-neered by Atomics International are two of the most important approaches to economical power



from the atom-the Sodium Reactor Experiment (SRE) and the Organic Moderated Reactor Experiment (OMRE)--which are being con-ducted for the Atomic Energy Commission. The SRE will soon be producing heat that will be converted into electricity by Southern California Edison. The OMRE, too, will assist in the design of full-scale electrical plants-one for Piqua, Ohio, and another for a Latin American country.

Atomics International also produces nuclear research reactors, which are being installed at home and abroad. "Foreign customers" include West Berlin, West Germany, Japan, Denmark. Today, in California, there are four nuclear reactors of different types which have been built by Atomics International for the Atomic Energy Commission. Atomics International is continu-ing to grow, hand in hand with the Valley.
