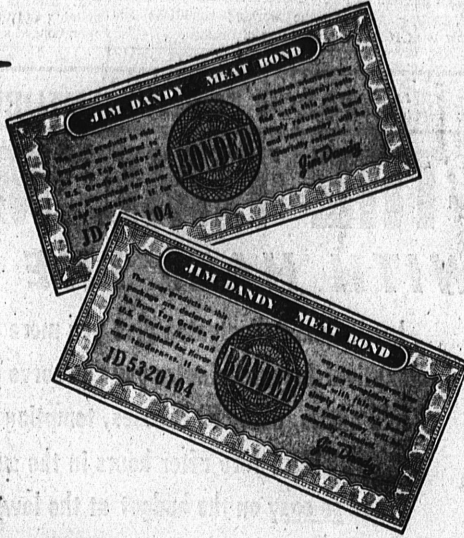
223rd Street
