Declaring a Right

When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and of nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident: That all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; that, to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed; that whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it and to institute new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and, accordingly, all experience hath shown that mankind are more disposed to suffer while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same object, evinces a design to reduce them under absolute despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such government and to provide new guards for their future security. Such has been the patient sufferance of these colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former systems of government.

Employers probably would get more work out of their workers and the vacationers would have more time to go farther and do more. Most employers know that a minimum of work is accomplished on the one-day islands between the holiday and the week end.

One national organization has set up a campaign to have all holidays celebrated on the Monday of the week in which they fall, thus offering a three-day week end. Labor Day, always the first Monday in September, is the only holiday set up this way. The rest of the holidays fall on varying days of the week and change from year to year. During 1957, there are five one-day islands between the week end and the holidays—New Year's Day and Lincoln's birthday, which fell on Tuesdays, and Memorial Day, July 4, and Thanksgiving, all of which occur on Thursdays.

Christmas is on Wednesday and Columbus Day falls on Saturday, Only two holidays happen to fall on a day either just before or after the week end—Veterans' Day on Monday and Washington's birthday on Friday.

Those who oppose the Monday holiday system claim that for sentiment's sake, the holiday should be celebrated on the day that the event actually happened. In many cases, the holiday we celebrate is mere tradition and doesn't

As a result, the whole strategic position of Russia is undermined. This satellite frontier had been planned by Russia as a buffer against any future military contingency. This is no longer true. For underground pressure is growing to the point that this area may not even remain neutral . . . but anti-Russian. This unexpected strategic upset may be the origin of the trouble inside the Kremlin istelf. For the anti-Stalinists blame the pro-Stalinists for this unfortunate change of events along the whole Soviet satellite frontier. The Kremlin is faced with the prospect of not only losing Stalinism among the satellites, but Sovietism and Communism.

Stallnism has definitely not worked inside the satellites. The alternative to Stallnism is nationalistic Communism, of the Tito pattern. Poland, as this now. But there are other this now. But there are other alternatives for the satellites as we see it.

There is the example of Austria, which was allowed to change into a neutralized national state, by the Russians. There there is Finland, which is actually a free state, but within the Soviet military defense system. The talk inside the satellites now is that some sort of military alliance of the Finnish order might be worked out with political independence from Russia. Actually Poland is almost in that status now, more so than Hungary.

A A A There is evidence that the Communist Wladyslaw Gomulate Poland is gradually getting out of the political control of Moscow. This is in contrast with the unfortunate attempt of Prime Minister Imre Nagy who tried to use the popular youth uprising in Hungary as a springboard for national emancipation and a complete break with Russia.

Gomulka has adopted a moderate Communist variation of the Tito line by demouning Stalinism (as Khrushchev did) and opposition to Soviet control, while adhering to Marxism and close cooperation with Marxist Russia.

At the recent meeting jointly sponsored by the Lomita Property Owners and Registered Voters, Inc., and the Lomita Civic League at which Mr. Anderson, county administrative officer, was guest speaker, it was brought to our attention the two methods of procedure now open to those opposed to incorporation.

No. 1. By exclusion — the method recently adopted by Rolling Hills—in which property owners ask to have their property excluded by writing a letter to the board of supervisors giving name, date, and legal description of the property be excluded from the boundaries. This should be done prior to Aug. 6 and in the hands of the board by that date, two days before the boundary hearing.

No. 2. The second method is by staying in the area and voting down incorporation—this method was adopted by Altadena with good success.

The first method involves certain risks. If your area was excluded it would still be open to annexation attempts. Also, if certain areas were excluded, the voters would be denied the right to express their opinion at the polls. It is also considered doubtful that the board of

* * * The repercussions of such an arrangement in Poland could seriously break down Soviet relations with other satellites, like Bulgaria, Romania, Czechoslovakia, Albania. It might even arouse nationalistic feelings inside the areas of Latvia, Lithuan la, Estonia, long annexed to Russia.

In planning your will, your lawyer will want to know your true wishes; and then, to help you realize them, he will want to know a few vital facts.

Are you married? Any children or grandchildren? Previously married? Widowed?

Your age and those of your beneficiaries? Legal! residence? Health?

You'll have to work out your plan in view of the laws governing death taxes, property laws, and, if you are married, separate and community property (as well as joint tenancy which you cannot will to anyone).

Age? If you wish to set up trusts in the will, your age and those of your beneficiaries may help you to decide whether, for example, to use capital of the trust fund as well as its income for the beneficiaries.

Your residence? Most important, since state laws govern many items of personal property.

supervisors would exclude long narrow corridors. Mr. Anderson stated that if enough people did ask for exclusion and it was granted, then incorporation would be ruled out completely if less than 500 remained in the area.

All the county officials we have talked to have warned us to be sure and take a long, hard look at incorporation before asking to become a city. Mr. Anderson pointed out that preliminary cost estimates frequently fail to cown all contingencies that arise and cities are left with staggering financial problems.

Don't forget, Torrance cannot annex Lomita without a vote of the people. Ever it he fringe areas cannot be taken in if the people oppose it.
