REGISTRATION STARTS AT EL CAMINO COLLEGE

Appointments for fall enrollment at El Camino College began this week as the college prepared for an annual record-breaking registration.

Each year in the decade of the college's existence, registration figures have reached a new all-time high. With both new and returning full-time students now making appointments for registration in the college counseling office, a fall figure approaching 10,000 students is foreseen by college administrators.

Registration procedures for four different classifications of students vary. Leo M. Christian, assistant director of student personnel, cautioned prospective students today.

Appointments for full-time students returning to the college or enrolling for the first time are being made at present.

Part-time students enrolled last spring will register on Aug. 7 and 8, those whose surnames begin with letters M-Z registering on Aug. 7 and those from A-L enrolling on the following day.

New students who wish to enroll for less than 10 units will register by permit beginning on Aug. 21. Permits for this group of students will be available on July 29 and after. Counseling appointments are

Returning students who qualified for priority registration by meeting spring counseling appointments will be notified of their enrollment appointments by mail.

"In every case," Christian cautioned, "it is advisable for students to register at the earliest possible time to get desired classes."

NORMONT TERRACE PLAN EYED

A decision on the abandonment of Normont Terrace, war housing project of 400 units at 253rd and Vermont, has been postponed by the Los Angeles Housing Authority.

Chairman George A. Beavers Jr., said the Authority had postponed action because of the city and county's request to allow study of using the housing for low income senior citizens. Under a proposed plan, the city and county might cooperate with the authority for such use. Cost and practicality of the plan will be studied.

Beavers said the Authority would be glad to consider any proposals, but said that final action must be taken at its next meeting.

Estimate Places Population of City at 90,101

The population of Torrance has passed the 90,000 mark, according to the Regional Planning Commission.

The new figures, 90,101, represented a 5000 increase over the last estimate in January and more than 8000 since the last official census last year which showed 82,241 people. City officials have indicated that another special census will be taken this year to take advantage of greater revenues from state taxes.

The whole county showed a general increase, with 5,507,429 people.

Other cities in the area included Redondo Beach, 42,761; Manhattan Beach, 32,058; Hermosa Beach, 15,867; El Segundo, 13,811; Palos Verdes Estates, 7599, and Rolling Hills, 1306. Only small gains were recorded in these cities, however.

Los Angeles' population was set at 2,333,838, while unincorporated county areas were figured to have 1,161,572 persons. Estimates for Long Beach were 309,347.
