#### Manuscripters Get Tips On 'Writing as Business'

"Writing as a business" was those who want quick fame, the subject of a talk given by Harold Braham at the July

Harold Braham at the July meeting of the Southwest Manuscripters.

Braham, who stepped in at the last minute to substitute for Malden Bishop who was ill, has an imposing career in the mystery field, with numerous short stories as well as eight novels to his credit.

Braham pointed out that writers generally fall into three categories: those who use writing only as an outlet,

and those who consider writing as a business.

Terms Considered.

Elaborating on the business of writing, Braham showed how the same terms that pertain to any commodity and to a story. For example, he said, package material so that it is saleable, considering competition and new trends.
