## Health Officer **Issues Warning On Rabies Peril**

Dr. Roy O. Gilbert, Los Angeles County Health Officer, this week issued a warning that rables is still endemic in Los Angeles County. So far this year there have ben reported 21 cases of animal rables—19 dogs, one cat and one skunk. Because of contacts with these and other suspected rabid animals: 185 persons have had to undergo the painful-Pasteur treatment.

Dr. Gilbert issued a special plea that all animal bites be reported immediately to the nearest County Health Center. Compliance with the rabies vaccination programs will not necessarily stop rabies immediately as the vaccination program is a long-range one whereas the rabies problem and danger of human infection is one with us now.

Law Cited

Failure to report immediately an animal bite sould result in additional bites or infection by the offending animal, or even in the loss of human life. It is well for everyone to realize that it is also a California State Law that anyone knowing of an animal bite is responsible for its being reported, Dr. Gilbert said.

The full cooperation of all residents is requested in that ALL animal bites be reported to the Torrance Health Center, 2300 W. Carson St., or to Dr. B. A. Kogan, M.D., District Health Officer, and complete information be given as to the patient and the animal concerned. The animal will then be closely observed during the critical 15 days as a protection by the person bitten.

It is also requested that pets kept on leashes or inside a Reveed yard at all times. Any animal suspected of having rapies or showing abnormal symptoms should be reported to the Los Angeles County Pound Department, LO 7-2293, in order that the suspicious animal may be impounded and closely observed.
