"Section 525.1 of the California Vehicle Code requires a driver who is driving slower than the normal speed of traffic to keep in the right had lane or as near the right edge or curb as is practical." declared Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell. "There would be less congestion and accidents act."

"To eliminate this condition motorists must stay in the right hand lane except when reparing to turn left or while workaking and passing an other vehicle," he concluded. "It is well to keep in mind the slow driver who persists in driving in the left hand lane is subject to a traffic citation."


