

NEW HARVEY PLANT... Artist's conception of Harvey Aluminum's new reduction plant, now under construction at The Dalles, Oregon. Scheduled to be in partial operation early in 1958; the facility will have an annual capacity of 108 million pounds of primary aluminum. Located on a scenic setting on the Columbia River, the plant is 2 miles east of

The Dalles and 82 miles east of Portland. Designed by Harvey engineers, the new reduction plant is reported to be an improvement upon all smelters now in operation. The electrolytic cells in which the aluminum is made are being built by Harvey Aluminum to maintain the best air control, minimize power consumption, and increase daily yield:
