Camino Welding Instructor Returns After World Tour

Selected by Stanford University as one of 22 men from the United States and Hawaii to be sent to the Philippine islands in an administrative educational capacity, Lester E. Golgart, weiding instructor at El Camino College, returned to the campus this semester with tales of experiences and souvenirs.

On leave of abschice for one year, Golgart assisted in the establishment of five teacher-training institutions for the Philippine Bureau of Education. The project consisted largely of training Filipino teachers in key institutions and assisting in the development of physical facilities and curriculum.

Changes Sought
The purpose of the project was to develop in that country teacher-training institutions in vocational education and industrial arts education similar to those of American state colleges and to change the programs from two to four years.

Golgart, although glad to be home, said he and his wife and three sons thoroughly enjoyed living and working in Manila. Living among the Filipino people in typical native housing, rather than in an American colony, made it possible to learn more of the habits and customs of these A sia tipepople.

"We reached the Red China border but couldn't get in." said Golgart, emphasizing, "We didn't want to, anyway" Next stop was a ngkok, Thailand, where the family visited Buddhist temples and cruised through floating markets on canals much like those found in Venice.


Peacocks and Monkeys
