**North American Gets Four-Year Electrical Research Contract**

North American Aviation's Los Angeles division has been awarded an Air Force contract for development of a revolutionary new electrical system capable of meeting the challenge of the thermal barrier, it was announced this week.

Terms of the new contract call for a four-year program devoted to the development of a complete airborne power-generating system capable of withstanding prolonged temperatures of 600 degrees Fahrenheit, or more than twice the capability of current electrical systems, which become marginal above 240 degrees.

The company is already engaged in attacking the thermal barrier on many other fronts, including that of hypersonic manned aircraft with the X-15 rocket research plane.

**Director Named**  
John Maxian Jr., chief electrical engineer, will direct the project, with John Piarro as electrical project engineer. Maxian is a 29-year veteran with North American and the electrical and electronics business. Piarro has been with the company for 10 years.

"This program," Maxian said, "is not aimed at any specific contract or plane. It is designed for the benefit of the Air Force and the industry as a whole. These findings will be for the benefit of all weapon system manufacturers and for components and equipment manufacturers as well."

"This is the first time that an all-inclusive contract of this size and nature has been let for research and development in the aircraft electrical field.

**For Tomorrow's Weapons**  
The program could lead to a complete new concept in the design of such items as wires and cables, circuit-breakers, generators, regulators, and constant speed generator drives, used in the electric power generating system. Adequate electrical power is the key to all electric and electronic systems and devices so essential to tomorrow's weapons.

Modernizing this system to meet the challenge of the high temperatures generated by air friction and propulsion systems in future aircraft will increase the tactical performance of radar, electronic, and other electric devices, North American engineers predict.

The work will be performed at the Los Angeles division and will be monitored by the Aeronautical Accessories Laboratory at the Air Research and Development Command's Wright Air Development Center.

The company will be responsible for managing the development and integration of the system into finished form, with much of the detail work being done by subcontractors under its supervision.
