#### Freelance Writer to Talk To Manuscriptures Friday

Southwest Manuscriptures will have an opportunity to hear a very prolific writer at their October 18th meeting, when Jay Ellis Ransom will be guest speaker.

Ransom, who got his B.A. at the University of Washington, has a varied background, editor of a daily newspaper in Oregon, anthropologist on the University of Michigan archeological research expedition to the Aleutian Islands, and doing archeological work on Crow Indian sites on the Wyoming-Montana border.

#### Prolific Writer

Ransom has been a freelance magazine article writer for the past 26 years. His published works include 30 scientific papers in university research journals in anthropology, education, linguistics and folklore; 50 popular magazine articles in geology, mineralogy and rockhound field trips; 150 magazine feature articles on male adventure, big game hunting, Alaska, and outdoor stories generally; and about 50 magazine features in miscellaneous fields of popular interest.

In addition, some of his poetry has appeared in various periodicals over the years. His books include two best-selling hobby books, "Arizona Gem Trails" and "Petrified Forest Trails." He is now completing, on assignment, a biography of a famous New York industrialist.

**Topic Announced**  
"How to Write Books and Make Money" will be the subject of Ransom's talk. He will deal primarily with non-fiction; what types of books sell, techniques of collecting information, organizing and laying out the blueprint in chapters, agenting the manuscript, etc. A record attendance is expected at what promises to be one of the outstanding meetings of the group.

The Southwest Manuscriptures meet every third Friday of the month at 8 p.m. at Clark Stadium, Hermosa Beach. Both established and beginning writers are welcome to attend meetings and join in the social coffee hour which follows.
