



KIDNEY BEAN AND MEAT BALL CASSEROLE

Milk—12 cup Soft bread crumbs—1 cup Salt—1 teaspoon Pepper—12 teaspoon Chili powder—14 teaspoon Sweet peppers—3 red or green Onions (sliced)—2 cups Salad oil or melted fat— 5 tablespoons Salt—1/2 teaspoon Tomato sauce....2 8-ounce

cans Red Kidney beans—3 No. 2 cans (7½ cups) Cheese (sharp Cheddar)— ½ lb.

Salad oil or melted fat— 1 ½ 1b. Combine milk, bread crumbs, salt, pepper and chili powder—add ground meat and mix well. Keep in refrig-erator for later use. Wash peppers, cut in 6 sections, re-move seeds. Peel and slice onions. Now form meat mix-ture into small balls and brown on all sides 5 or 6 minutes. Remove from skillet. Cook onions in same skillet with ½ teaspoon salt until soft. Add fomato sauce and peppers. Let simmer 8 to 10 minutes—stir occasionally. Drain kidney beans and put into shallow 4 quart casserole. (I usually use 2 -quart casseroles and put one in freezer for later use). Cut cheese into ½ inch cubes, add tomato mixture. Stir well—spoon over beans in casserole. Add border of meat balls. Bake in 350 degree oven for 40 to 45 minutes.
