Constitution Party Plans '58 Campaign

Col. William P. Gale, 41, for Constitution Party candidate for governor of California, outlined his views at a press conference with South Bay newspapermen at the Pen & Quill Restaurant, Tuesday. Legal status will be granted the Constitution Party if tobtains signatures of 50,000 registered voters. It would then go on the 1958 official State ballot.

Official Resigns

The Constitution Party in Indies such men as Robert B. Ferguson, who recently resigned from the Los Angeles County Re public an Central Committee, and joined the new party in order "to cast a vote for my principles."

A party spokesman outlined the principles upon which the party was founded. It favors, he said, "an annual balanced budget, retirement of the national debt, and repeal of the Federal Income-tax."

"This last should be accomplished," he said, "by the simple expediency of discontinuing foreign aid giveaway programs and return of foreign trade to control of Congress."

Equal Application

"The party a dvocates the application of laws equally, against monopolies whether of business, labor or other groups, insuring the right to work to all people. It opposes compulsory union members hip. It impes elemination of government ownership or operation by business, not specified in the Constitution, and repeal of the Federal Reserve Act."
