That was the word from the State Department of Public Health this week, as it urged some 3,00,000 unvaccinated Californians under 40 to obtain the Salk polio shots, Some 6,000,000 Californians have received at least one polio shot. According to Dr. Malcolm Merrill, state director of public health, the winter is the best time to receive the series of shots, since the height of the polio season is reached in late spring.

The gaping hole undermined the west wing of the club and caused a couple of cracks in the building which were quick ly repaired.


