Employers Must File Tax Forms By February 16

State Controller Alan Cran-ston, chairman or the Fran-chise Tax Board, stated this week that the due date for fil-ing Forms 599 and 596, infor-mation returns, is Monday, Feb. 16.

Feb. 16. All individuals, partnerships, and corporations engaged in a trade or business in California who make payments of salar-ies, interest, dividends, rents, and other types of income must file these reports, Cranston said. said.

said. Employers must file an in-formation return, Form 599, for each single employee who earned %35000 or more and each married employee who earned %35000 or more during 1958, the controller explained. "Payments of dividends dur-ing 1958 to any one individual must be reported if the total amount was \$100 or more. Form 599 must be filed report-ing payments of interest, royal-

ing payments of interest, royal-ties, and other fixed or de-terminable income for each person paid \$200 or more," he added.

added. State information returns, Forms 599 and 596, may be ob-tained from the office of the Franchise Tax Board at 1025 P Street, Sacramento 14.
