Capt. Mitsuo Fuchida, former commander who led the air attack on Pearl Harbor and who is now a man of God, Commander of God's Sky Pilot Christian Missionary Army of Japan, will appear at the

South Bay Church of God, 17661 Yukon Ave., Thursday evening, March 12th, at 7:30 p.m.

Capt. Fuchida will tell why he was chosen by the High Command of the Imperial Japanese Navy to lead the air attack, why as a loyal soldier and officer, he followed the orders of the high command as he was trained to do, even as do our military men.

He will tell how God, through His Word (the Bible) converted his life from war to peace; and how he is now spending the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel message of Peace.

Plans are already underway for Pasadena's New Year's Day activities. A nation-wide contest to select the theme for the 1960 Tournament of Roses parade is being launched this week.

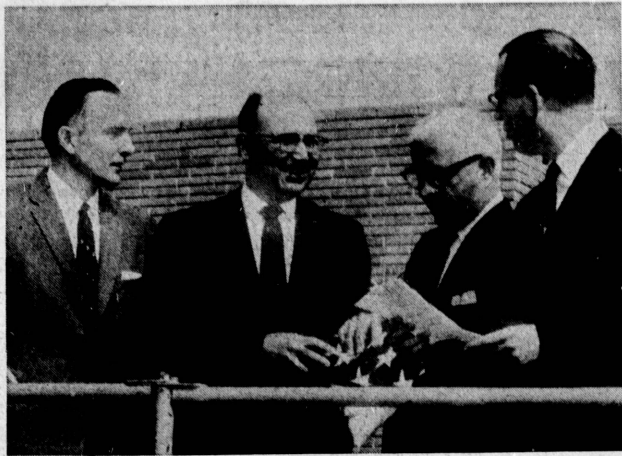

Each entrant may submit as many ideas as he wishes, but may not include more than one theme suggestion per post card, along with his name and address.

The theme selected will be used as the basis for the 1960 parade. This motif will be followed by all of the 60 parade entrants in their decorations and floats.

Theme of the recent 1959 Rose parade was "Adventure in Flowers." Among other themes used in the 70 year history of the Rose parade were "Famous Firsts," "Day-dreams in Flowers," "History," "Fairytales," and "Songs, Poems and Dreams."

The month-long contest will close April 15. President Dorn said that the lucky winner will be chosen shortly thereafter by a panel of Tournament officials.
