### The Art Corner

The third annual spring show of the Torrance Art Group on display again this weekend brings to the Torrance-South Bay area art-work of many media, well-displayed, available for all to see. Theme of the exhibition is "People, Places, Ideas." Each of the exhibiting artists have been asked to indicate in which category they wished their work shown. A brief statement by the artist displayed with the art-work will aid the viewer to understand what the artist is trying to say.

The exhibition is varied in type of work shown. Among the oil paintings, Moni Gillett's "Outer Harbor," is outstanding for its beautiful color and design; Barbara Regalado's small paintings charm with their sensitive use of texture and color, Robert Neathery's fine "Early Thaw" is very well-handled.

W. A. Krimmel's "Smithy," is nostalgic in the primitive manner, while Don Wright's, "The Searchers" comes through with strength because of his excellent use of pattern and color. Also worthy of mention are the work of Joyce Fairchild, Vlasta Field, Betty Maxwell, Pat Spingeld.

Traditionalists, Jan Dailey, Edythe Kerr, Kay Korell, good in their own way, contrast strongly with abstractionist A. J. Schneider's "Power Symbol" and Keith Crown's "Still Life."

VARA GRUBE's work in the exhibit and Robert Neathery's, "The Cove," done in water colors, are worth seeing for their expert handling of the medium. Marian Cummings vigorous splashing in her water color, "The Shack" and caseins "Jazz" and "Jezebel" reflect her keen enthusiasm for painting. James Crump's "Desert Land" and "Wild Trees" show a good mastering of casein techniques.

Lillian Baker's delicate charcoal sketch "Wanda," and Bette Seidler's mixed media "Male and Female," and ink drawing "Mountain in A Hot Sky," are skillfully rendered and very appealing. Evelyn Zeitler's collage "Still Life" and mosaic lamp base, reflect a varied approach to art done with skill and taste. Not to be missed are Moni Gillett's monoprnt "Famine" and Keith Crown's ink drawing series in the drawing and print selection.

LARGE in scale and approach, Mark White's pieces of sculptures are a handsome part of the exhibit. Don Wright's terra cotta piece "Manimal" is well-executed.

Lee Cummings, Joyce Swanson, Jean Townsend, Ola Laurent, Martha Briggs, Kinne Downs, Frederick Fox, Robert Hogan, Ralph Rollins, Vicki Feldon, are some of the other Torrance Art Group members who are represented in the exhibition.
