Legislators Introduce Bill To End Installment Frauds

Concrete evidence of the fact that our system of legislative interim committees does work out sound, equitable solutions to practical problems in everyday living is to be found in the retail installment sales law which is now progressing steadily through the current session.

It would require that every retail installment contract be put in writing, that there be

Public hearings held last year by a subcommittee of he Assembly interim committee on finance and insurance spotlighted many of the evils which grew up to plague consumers, as well as ethical retailers, in installment buying. Witnesses before the group documented specific cases in which buyers were obliged by contracts, whose terms they did not know, to pay twice the value of a given article, to pay interest as high as 360 per cent, or to pay exhorbitant "service charges" of various types.

ITS HEARINGS over, the subcommittee sat down to draft a remedial law. Its members enlisted the help of credit and fiscal experts from all over the state and representatives of consumer groups, and also studied laws proposed or enacted in other states. The full Assembly committee approved its recommendations, and a bill to enact them was introduced in this session. A majority of Assembly members signed it as co-authors. When the bill was heard in regular committee, it was strongly supported by important retailer organizations, and criticism was almost completely lacking. It passed the Assembly and is now before the Senate for consideration.

The bill would regulate all phases of installment selling of personal property bought for personal or household use except airplanes, boats and cars. Its primary purpose is to insure that there will be complete understanding of the terms and conditions of such sales between buyers and sellers so as to protect the proper interests of both in all transactions.
