Twenty-nine members of Cub Scout Pack 725C received awards at a court of honor held Tuesday, March 24.

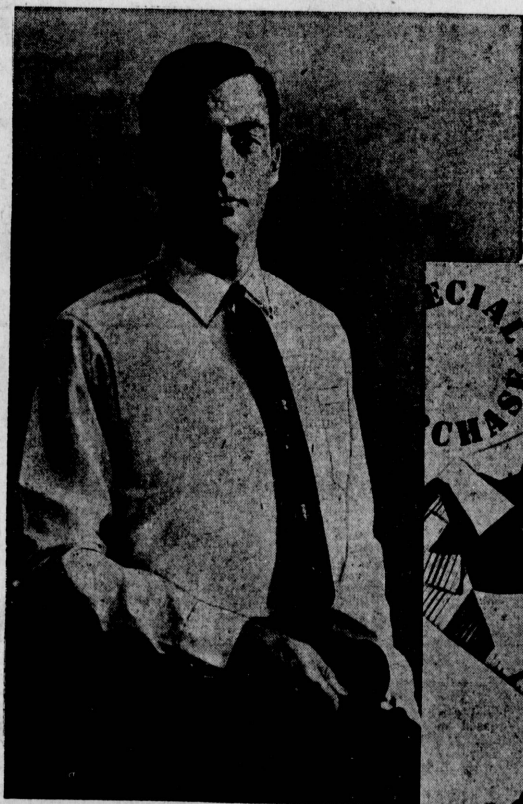

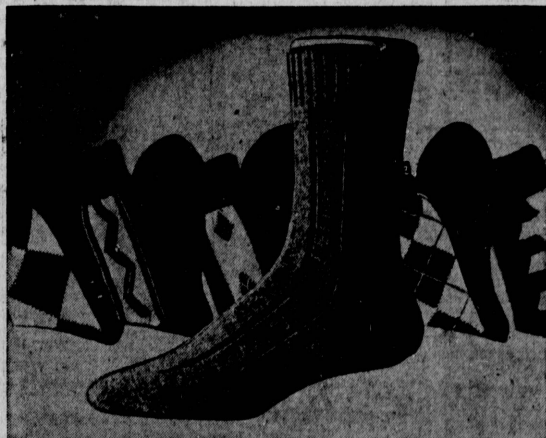
