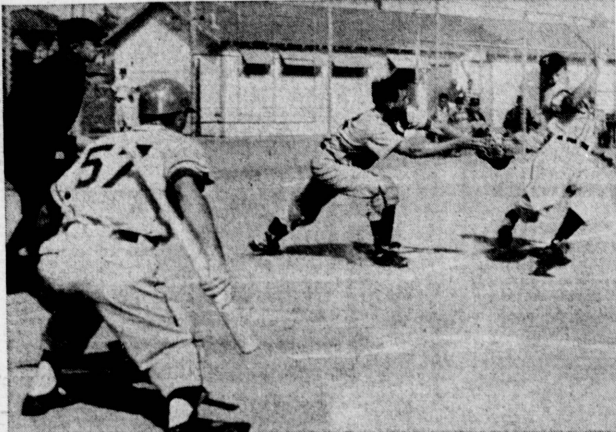

Parnelli Jones May Enter Indy Classic in '60

Heralded as the greatest "natural" driver to be produced in the Southland since Troy Ruttman, 1952 Indianapolis winner, young Parnelli Jones of Torrance goes for main event win No. 5 in the CRA sprint car races Wednesday night at Ascot Stadium.

Jones, like Ruttman, has demonstrated versatility in midgets, stock cars and big cars, and is expected to accept an Indianapolis mount in 1960. He voluntarily refused a car this year as he feels he needs another year of seasoning, track officials said.
