Installment Credit Limits Set by New Legislation

A bill to protect the consum-er from excessive interest charges and other abuses in installment credit selling, spon-sored by Assemblyman Vincent Thomas of San Pedro, has been signed into law by Governor Brown.

The bill, which Thomas called "the most important piece of ecenomic legislation considered by the State Legislature in years, probably since the depression," was aimed at installment selling racketeers uncovered by an interim committee study last year.

Thomas said the bill provides that in all credit transactions of \$50 or more:

1. There must be a clear warning to the buyer to read the contract.

2. The contract must set forth the cash sale price, down payment, trade-in and other terms.

payment, trade-in and other terms.

3. Insurance coverage must be at authorized premium rates.

4. A limit of 5/6 of one potent on the unpaid balance of items under \$1000, with a limit of 2/3 of one per cent on unpaid balance over \$1000.

5. Contracts must include provisions for full payment before expiration of contract.

provisions for full payment be-fore expiration of contract, with a portion of the financing charge to be refunded. Wage attachments are pro-hibited and repossessions limit-ed under the act.
