Because the costs of producing American steel have risen so high, it is becoming increasingly difficult for American steel companies to meet competition both here and abroad. This trend to foreign products or substitute materials has resulted in serious unemployment. Unemployment involves you!
- 5. ADEQUATE PROFITS ARE ESSENTIAL TO PROGRESS. Profit dollars are as important to employees as to employers. They are paid out to buy land, buildings, equipment for building and modernizing plants and for creating jobs. Over the past ten years steel profits have been too low.
