

## Los Cancioneros Concert To Be Showcase of Melody

Highlighting the ninth annual concert of Los Cancioneros, to be presented at Redondo Union High School Friday and Saturday, May 22 and 23, will be a music drama entitled "Broadway, Broadway, Broadway," directed by James Brittain of Manhattan Beach, MGM-TV production assistant.

Included in the show tunes to be featured in the music drama will be musical selections from such Broadway successes as "Guys and Dolls," "My Fair Lady," and "The Music Man." Choreography will be staged by Brittain, and sets will be designed by Ray Wallace of Rolling Hills.

Mr. Brady will perform the Concerto for Trumpet by Eugene Bozza, which is used as an entrance examination for trumpet players applying to the Paris Conservatory of Music.

Following the concert Youth Band Mothers will hold a reception for the members of the Junior Woman's Club in the auditorium.
