1 lbs. venison (cut in ¾4" 1 can tomato soup cubes)
3 lbsp. fat 5 c. chopped onion 1 garlic clove (minced)
1 6 oz. can mushrooms 1 cup sour cream On all venison strip off fat to remove gamey flavor. Dip venison in flour, brown in hot fat. Add onion, garlic and mushrooms. Combine remaining ingredients; pour over meat. Simmer until tender, about 1 hour. May be served over rice or spaghetti. Serves 4-6. This recipe can be doubled or tripled and the extra may be put in the freezer for quick meals.
