## Health Center Services Six Area Schools

Area Schools

Children from six Torrance area schools are among the 353 patients which have visited the Gardena Health Center, 1202 Magnolia Ave. since its opening last November 25.

Dental checkups at the clinic are provided to needy students from Bonita. Carson, Del Amo, Halldale, 223rd and 232nd St. Schools from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Besides dental examinations and diagnosis, the clinic offers low income families eye and hearing tests, removal of diseased tonsils and adenoids, orthopaedic examination and x-rays, corrective physical education for posture problems, referrals to Orthopaedic Hospital and to the Heart Assn. for serious problems and child Primary purpose of the clinics, sponsored by Tenth District PTA. the Los Angeles Board of Education, and the Community Chest, is to recognize and evaluate dental and health problems in their true light, to advise parents, and help children in meeting the whole problem, according to Mrs. Ruth Jackson, health cented manager.
