Pursuant to your request, the following information pertains to the posting and publication requirements for the issuance of alcoholic beverage licenses and the provisions authorizing protests to the issuance of such licenses. Section 23985 of the Business and Professions Code provides that within five days after filing an application to engage in the sale of any alcoholic beverages at any premises, notice of such intention shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the entrance to the premises and that no license shall be issued for the premises until the notice has been posted for at least 30 consecutive days.
