- The secret to long bloom with most plants is to keep faded blooms picked of. Letting them go to seed saps energy from the plant.
- Remember the axiom in lawn care: Fertilize lightly and frequently—water deeply and infrequently. Ask your nurseryman to recommend a schedule.
- Keep pinching fuchsias to encourage bushy owth. Feed them with liquid fish at least once a onth for good results.
- For a quick fill-in of early summer color, try the dwarf bedding dahlias. They are available as inexpen-sive seedlings in nursery flats.
- 5. Keep after snails and slugs. Bait or pellets should be placed at intervals throughout the garden for
