"Bank of America savings depositors received almost \$100 million in interest payments during 1957," stated President S. Clark Beise at the bank's head office.

Growth Seen

Loans outstanding were \$5,-554,784.021, representing an increase of \$201,748,030 since Dec. 31, 1956.

The bank's investments in securities stood at \$2,742,530,348, as compared with \$2,518,301,682 a year previously.

President Beise reported that net operating earnings, after provision for applicable taxes, were \$71,974,951 or \$2.81 per share on the 25,600,000 shares outstanding.

"This figure, which com-pares with \$2.89 per share for 1956, demonstrates that the higher interest rates currently paid on savings deposits are being offset and that during 1957 the trend of earnings showed a continuing improve-

A total of 241 students are taking part in the high schools' work experience program for credit, while an additional 91 are working two periods and going to school the rest of the day. 
