NUT ROLL

1/2 lb. butter 2 tsp. sugar
4 cups flour 4 egg yolks
2 yeast cakes 1 cup lukewarm water
Dissolve yeast in warm milk. Work butter, flour, sugar, egg
yolks together. Divide dough in four parts and let stand for

NUT ROLL FILLING

2 cups water
2 cups sugar
1 lb. ground walnuts
Roll out dough, cover with nut mixture. Make four rolls.

Brush rolls with egg white. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes in mod-

Mrs. Moss says that poppy seeds may be used in the filling instead of nuts. The four rolls make about 100 slices. They will keep indefinitely in the refrigerator.
