Pedestrians At Fault

Perhaps no place in the world has as stern regulations intended to protect the pedestrian as California. Still, pedestrians are being struck in the crosswalks, supposedly their very own haven of safety.

Many injuries and deaths in pedestrian lanes are due to careless drivers. Just as often, we suspect, the pedestrians have courted death by placing too much faith in a white line on the pavement. They walk into the crosswalks without looking; they dawdle, and some even seem to be daring the motorist to hit them.

Most cautious drivers are fully aware of the rights of the pedestrian, even so they sometimes are involved in accidents or violations that might have been avoided had the pedestrian merely hesitated or speeded up. After all, a normal pedestrian still has more maneuverability than a

The Safety Council president offered these tips for wet

weather driving: Keep your windshield clean and be sure wipers are in

good working order. Remember that stopping distances are greatly increased

Keep plenty of distance between your car and the car

ahead. Smooth tires are dangerous at any time, but even more

so on wet streets. Steer clear of the white line-it's slippery when wet.

To help keep brakes dry, apply them gently when driving through deep water.

Test brakes after driving through flooded areas. You can dry wet brakes by applying the brake and slowly accelerating at the same time.

If you have a rainy day mishap don't blame the weather. You can't regulate the weather, but you can control your driving.


