## Gas Company To Expand Area System

Area bystem

A budget of more than \$1.5 million has been allotted to handle capital expenditures by the Southern California Gas Co. here in its Southwest Division, it was announced today by Division Manager C. W. Shupp.

Part of the company's near-record \$40,263,000 overall capital budget, some \$1,558,000, is required to handle the rapidly expanding population and growing industrial centers in this area, Shupp said.

Primarily, the money is slated to cover costs of adding new customers, reinforcing gas supply systems, and continuing

new customers, reinforcing gas supply systems, and continuing a program of property replace-ments and additions. This is the third largest over-all budget in the company's 90-year history and the third straight year the budget has exceeded the \$40 million mark. Largest expenditures in the

Largest expenditures in the firm's Southwest Division budget are \$359,400 for installation of some 117,000 feet of new business mains, and \$349,000 for installation of new business saviges new business services.
