

> FRESH APPLE PECAN CAKE 1 c white sugar 1 tsp. salt 1 c sweet milk 1 c brown sugar 1/2 c crisco 2 eggs

2½ c flour	1 tsp.	soda	Y
2 c raw apples	1 tsp.	baking	powder
(chopped finely)			

Mix all ingredients, except apples, until well blended. Fold in apples. Put in pan, 8 inches by 13 inches. Cover with 1/2 cup or more brown sugar and sprinkle with chopped pecans.
