in this area may now file appli-cations for annual tax exemp-tions in the assessor's office at the Torrance City Hall, 3301 Torrance Blvd. The two officials pointed out that veterans often do not realize that requests for tax exemption of the first \$1000 of their property must be renew-ed each year. Counties throughout the state accept re-throughout the state accept re-throu their property must be renew-ed each year. Counties throughout the state accept requests during a period run-ning from the first Monday in March to the last Monday in

May. Eligibility is limited to veterans who do not own proper-ty worth \$5000 or more, based on assessed valuations. Veter-ans' widows, widowed mothers, or pensioned mothers and fathers of veterans also may

qualify. Certain paraplegic veterans who occupy "wheelchair" homes are entitled to \$5000 tax exemptions on those


